Purpose and Statement of Function

Naíonra Céimeanna Beaga is a privately owned school. It is defined as sessional under the Child Care (Early Years Services) Regulations 2016. It aims to provide a quality Naíonra for children aged between 3-5 years 8 months. We offer two daily sessions from 8.45 am -11.45pm and 12 pm -3pm . We are open 38 weeks per year roughly in line to the national schools. Our ration is 1:11.

Aims

 The Naionra endeavours to provide a pleasant, stimulating, welcoming, safe and healthy environment for all children.

2. The Naíonra aims:

- To run the service through the medium of Irish.
- To provide the child with the necessary opportunity and support to acquire Irish naturally, and in the case of the child whose home language is Irish, to facilitate the enrichment of that child's first language.
- To promote the total development of the child through play, while supporting the role of the parent in the development and education of their child.
- To promote equal opportunities for all children.
- To promote a quality service support service for parents.
